Keeping this purpose in mind, respond to the following: Everyone belongs to many different communities defined by (among other things) shared geography, religion, ethnicity, income, cuisine, interest, race, ideology or intellectual heritage. Choose one of the communities to which you belong, and describe that community and your place within it.
- 2). Your parents and education thought you to think critically, advocate passionately, and lead courageously. How has your Cultural leadership experience helped you develop these skills and how would you like to further advance your Cultural leadership skills?
- 3). Highlight the extent of your leadership. ...State the reasons for getting involved in a leadership role. ...State the obstacles you faced and how you overcame them. ...How did your leadership skills help you grow as a person and leader? How will your leadership skills impact your future?
- 4). TELL US ABOUT A CONTRIBUTION YOU'VE MADE TO YOUR COMMUNITY...WHO HAS BEEN YOUR BIGGEST INFLUENCE (OR INSPIRATION)? TELL US ABOUT A TIME WHERE YOU STEPPED UP AS A LEADER.

Those not recalled will dance their sets with 1 adjudicator and no additional charge.

Light Round will be performed 1st. Under 8 and Under 9 Girls and Boys must perform Traditional Set Dance.

Dancers will dance 3 at a time up until the age of Under 14, then 2 at a time after that.

2 solo results will also be awarded during awards.

Big Apple Feis Committee has the authority to combine competitions if numbers have small entries

Team Championships

Each team will perform one ceili dance (Jig or Reel timing)

Directives for Ceili, figure & Team Dancing

(a) Dancers in Ceili, Figure, and Dance Drama may compete in his or her own age group or in the next age group up. Dancers may NOT compete in an age group lower than their actual age.

- (b) Dancers who move up cannot move up more than one age group (Ex: Under 10 dancers can compete in u10 or u12 but not u15 & older) 50% of the team must be in the correct age group.
- (c) When necessary to complete an eight-hand team, 25% may repeat from a lower age group.
- (d) Adult ceili competitions are confined to those over the age of 18 who have not competed except as an adult during the past 5 years.

Mixed Teams:

25% of mixed ceili teams must be male dancers (min. of 1 male per four hand dance and 2 males per eight hand dance).

Multiple Teams:

- (a) Dancers may not compete in more than one team in any competition for any class of figure dancing.
- (b) When there is more than one team from a school entered in the same competition, please differentiate teams by using A, B, or C etc.
- (c) If a school enters more than one team in a competition and there is one team that does not participate, the remaining team(s) must dance in the earliest rotation spot assigned to the school. (ex. If team A, B, C from the same school are assigned #1, 4, and 9 and only B & C teams participate then they must appear as #1 & #4.

Entry:

- (a) Every competitor repeating a competition must be listed on a form provided with entry forms

A panel of 3 will adjudicate all team championships. Figure and Dance Drama Music has to be provided one hour due to start time.

- *In the 15-18 grade each competitor shall play two slow airs, one selected by the adjudicator from a list of six submitted and the other by the competitor from the remaining five on the list.*
- *In the Over 18 grade each competitor shall play three slow airs, two selected by the adjudicator from a list of eight submitted and the other selected by the competitor from the remaining six on the list.*

Solo Traditional Singing

- Grade (a) two songs of his/her own choice - slow & lively.
- Grades (b) and (c) - two songs from a list of four submitted (two slow and two lively) - one his/her own choice, the second a contrasting song to be selected by the adjudicator.
- Grade (d) two songs from a list of six submitted (4 slow and 2 lively): one of his/her own choice, the second a contrasting song to be selected by the adjudicator.

In all lists of songs, the lively songs must be clearly denoted. Newly Composed Ballad - must not previously have been sung at any fleadh prior to the current year. Lyrics for newly composed songs must be submitted in writing with entry and must accompany results to All-Ireland level. Songs in waltz time should be avoided.

Whistlers and fiddlers may be included, as well as players of bodhran and bones, but piano and drums are not permitted. Efforts should be made to play tunes other than jigs, reels and hornpipes, e.g. slow airs, set dances, old marches, harp music etc. Attention should also be given to instrumentation arrangements and presentation of the music. A list of music pieces in the order to be Played, e.g. slip jig, march, etc., shall be submitted by each group leader to the adjudicators prior to the performance.

Accompaniment: This competition is restricted to the following instruments: piano, harp, guitar, bouzouki-type instruments. The adjudication is on the accompaniment only.
